Purpose of Meeting

Federal law requires that each Title I school jointly develop with parents and family members of all children the following:

- School-Parent Compact
- Parent and Family Engagement Policies
 - Opportunities to Build School Capacity
- Comprehensive Needs Assessment & Schoolwide Plan
- Budget for family engagement activities (if receiving more than \$500K in Title 1 part A funds)



Annual Family Evaluation

Each year, we conduct an annual evaluation to ask parents to help us determine the effectiveness of the parent and family engagement program in improving the academic quality of our Title I school/Program, including identifying possible barriers to greater participation of parents in activities and programs.

Additionally, our school will use the findings from the annual evaluation to design evidence-based strategies for more effective family engagement and to revise the Title I parent and family engagement policies.

Title I was passed in 1965 under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). It is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools.

- In Delaware, all Title I schools currently operate schoolwide programs. Any Title I school with at least 40% poverty can operate a schoolwide program.
- Congress designed the schoolwide program model recognizing that high-poverty schools face a variety of challenges, and they need the ability to use Title I funds to implement comprehensive improvements and initiatives to assist struggling students by improving the school as a whole.

Title I schools receive extra funding (Title I dollars) from the federal government. These dollars are used to:

- identify students experiencing academic difficulties and provide assistance to help these students;
- purchase additional staff, programs, materials, and/or supplies; and
- conduct parent and family engagement meetings, trainings, events, and/or activities.



How Did SMS Use Title I Funds?

In the 2022-2023 school year, our school was allotted approximately **\$211,817** in Title I funding.

We developed a **Schoolwide Program**, which means we plan to spend our funds on the following:

- Supplemental staff/ instructional support:
 - Portion of Salaries & OECs of several Associate Teachers (student support staff)
 - Associates provide additional classroom support to ensure no child gets left behind.
 - Associates come with additional skillsets (multi-lingual, community connections and resources, counseling/professional training) that benefit all students.





Projected Use of Funds for 2023-2024

- Additional teachers and paraprofessionals
- Smaller class sizes
- Low teacher: student ratio



What is a School-Parent Compact?

A school-parent compact is a written commitment that outlines how the entire school community – teachers, families, and students will share the responsibility for improved academic achievement.

Information in the compact must include at minimum:

- Jointly developed in partnership with parents/families
- School Improvement Goals
- Academic-focused shared responsibilities that are aligned with school goals;
- Regular, two-way meaningful communication opportunities between staff and families.
- Partnership Building between school and parents


